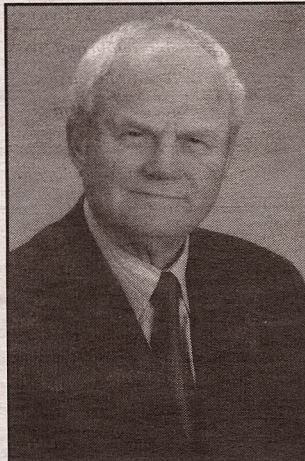
But, he is a believer in what Wisconsin Lions have created through the WLF and he especially believes in the need to preserve Lions Camp for future generations of children and adults with special needs.
